## 4. T. Wittmann – BRT Construction Project \*impact on Eldon House

The Curator Director gave summary of the activities related to construction impact to Eldon House of the Downtown Loop Construction Project. The construction fence was put up on March 28 and that is when learned the dig site would be north of Fullarton St. nearly opposite entrance to the Museum property. Staff had to react fast to this fast evolving construction site. Issues of major concern raised with contractors and the City are vibration and potential damage to artifacts; dust/dirt damage to grounds and interior of Eldon House, lack of communication and making access by pedestrian and vehicle difficult as parking a challenge on surrounding streets. This will cause a decrease in visitors due to this disruption. Some artifacts have been removed from public exhibit to protect against falling or other damage.

A presentation given by A. Williams provided details of project The stage 1 work will be completed by mid to late June with base asphalt on road to reopen to vehicles. The process being used is micro drilling rather than trench style so to minimize vibration and other potential issues. Vibration monitors have been set up within Eldon House. The PowerPoint will be distributed to the Curator Director and Board Chair.

Questions were answered by the City of London representatives.
